

# Holiday Harmony, a Plethora of Performances To Enrich and Inspire

"Have Yourself a Merry Little Christmas" has been playing on the PA speakers of stores and shopping malls since before Thanksgiving and rap versions of "Jingle Bell Rock" abound on the radio. But if this is your child's only exposure to America's Holiday culture you're missing a wonderful opportunity to explore and discover wonderful music, art and drama.

A new shirt or blouse will last a season or two and be forgotten. But hearing Handel's Messiah for the first time, seeing the Nutcracker Suite, hearing a live Klezmer band, dining at a Renaissance Feast or seeing an enactment of "Christmas Carol" remain shared memories for life.

Instead of more material things or one more mindless video/computer game that will lose its appeal as soon as the new 'latest trendy item' is marketed, give a gift that you can share together – plan out together, enjoy together and remember together. This works whether you're a two parent traditional family or a divorced or single parent, a grandparent, real or 'adopted' aunt or uncle.

If you are inexperienced at attending 'cultural' events – ask a friend or teacher to help you choose something that you and your child can more easily 'digest' and enjoy. For example: if you have never gone to a 'Messiah' concert – don't start with the complete version. Try a 'Christmas Portion' concert first. (There are also 'sing-in' versions for singers who wish to take the score and sing along.) Don't be afraid to learn and experience new things with your children.

We are so fortunate to live in an area that abounds with cultural events! Right here in Bucks County we will have December performances of holiday orchestral music including a Klezmer band at the Delaware Valley Philharmonic (see [www.dvpo.org](http://www.dvpo.org)), a "Messiah" concert by the Bucks County Choir accompanied by the Chestnut Hill Orchestra (see [www.bcpai.org](http://www.bcpai.org)) and several dramatic and musical versions of "Christmas Carol" (see local papers).

In Philadelphia there are even more events like The Pennsylvania Ballet's "Nutcracker Suite" and Longwood Gardens Christmas displays. Many art museums do special Christmas histories and exhibits at this time of year. And New York is only an hour by train. What a wealth of events there!

Don't forget that tickets for after-holiday events make a great gift as well as gift certificates for music, drama, dance or art lessons!

In the hullabaloo of holiday giving, it is easy to become overwhelmed with the need to give and get material gifts. But the message in all these 'holy days' whether it's Christmas, Hanukkah or Ramadan is that life has deepened dimensions. Giving gifts that enrich and inspire us can bring out true 'Holiday Harmony'.
